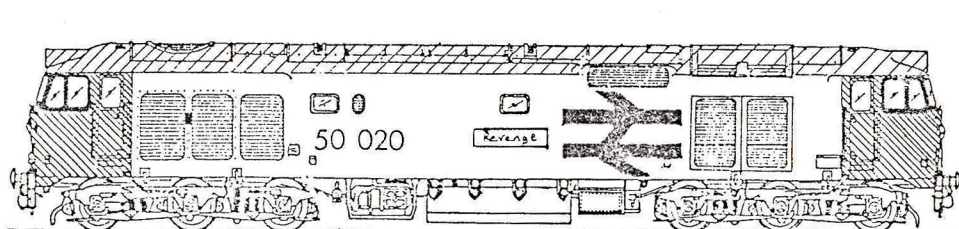
TRIP TO THE EAST LANCASHIRE RAILWAY

It is essential that all those wishing to take part should bring a non-refundable deposit of £3 per person to the May meeting. It is anticipated that the total cost of coach travel to the Railway will be £5.00 per person. The trip is open to members, and their families, or friends.

The Railway itself offers 'Day Rover' tickets for those who wish to make several journeys during the course of the day, as well as conventional single or return fares.

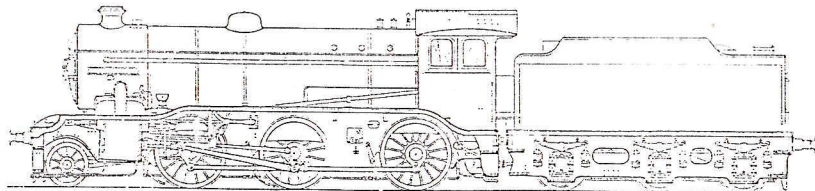

A NOTE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

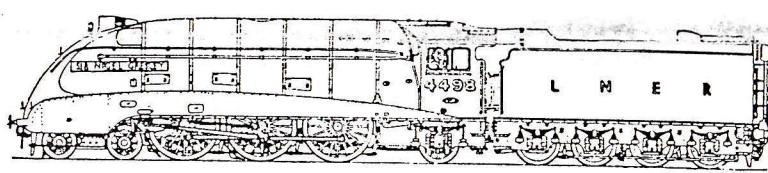
What a night!

Thank you also to Matthew Brown, and Simon Foster for their photographic display.

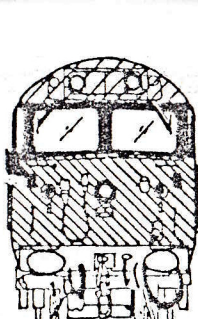
